Receive visitors/public comment: Rick Scott updated the council that he has received a request to close E 1st Street from John Street to Cherry Street for a street dance and live auction at the Rusty Rench on August 18 from 3pm to Midnight.

REPORTS:

Ambulance Report: Lonni Koch reported 33 calls for June and that Shonda Jeffrey has successfully completed testing to be an EMT.

Fire Report: Fire Chief Jake Koch reported 16 calls, training will be on vehicle extrication and fire. Sunday at 2p.m. fire department will be on standby at the fairgrounds with West Branch for the Tuff Truck competition, County fire will be at Atallissa, new radio system is expected to start transitioning in about 4-6 weeks.

Police Report: Rick Scott police report consisted of 80 Calls for service, 2 thefts; 4 traffic stops, 1 citation, 4 warnings, 3 investigations worked, 15 speak with officer; 10

public assists; 7 animal calls with 2 being dog bites and 5 at large; 7 assist other agencies, 1 assault; 1 domestic, 4 nuisances; and 2 accidents.

Public Works Report: Daniel Pike reported receiving bid for Crestview \$1350 and \$4020 for N Fayette Street; Lead and copper sampling changes being made to locations; mowing; spraying; asked about removing flowers on south part of cemetery; reported taking tree branches to Stanwood burn site in exchange for 8 hours of street sweeping for them each year; Cemetery flowers can be removed if the family members are not maintaining and the weeds are growing up into the flowers.

Administration Report: Coppess reported that the Board of Adjustments denied the request for a variance; Friendship roofing last said they would be here the week of June 18 to do roof, no sign of them yet.

Discussion and possible action on:

Proposal from Blue Line Solutions: The answers to the questions that were asked of the vendor at the prior meeting were brought and discussed; Amy Bishop motioned, Jen Lester seconded to approve the revised 2 year contract subject to review by the city attorney along with the sample ordinance from the City of Blue Grass. Ayes all. Motion carried. The proposed ordinance will be drafted and brought back at the next meeting for the first reading.

Matt Pivitt, Republic Services recycling services: Provided information about their company and apologized for not getting formal written proposal sent ahead of time. If the city were to change it would be no glass pick up; carts would be like garbage containers, and it would be every other week instead of each week at same price.

Policy review for possibly adding call-out definition to personnel manual: Council reviewed definition for a call out to be an order to report for emergency or special work, at an unusual time or place; monthly council meetings are part of everyone's regular schedule and are not considered a call out or call back to work, employees get paid for actual time at meeting, not an automatic 2 hours when it's a half hour meeting. Employees may come in late on those days.

Resolution 2023-11 to transfer funds from Sewer into Sewer Sinking Fund: Motion by Adam Paidar, seconded by Doug Weber to transfer the funds. Ayes: Bishop, Paidar, Lester, Weber, and Brown. Nays: None. Resolution adopted.

Policy regarding ballpark being used as a "dog park": Council discussed both views of being able to let pets run and the issue with the leash law prohibiting the dogs from running loose, unless they were under the control of their owner at all times and there is a law that owners are to clean up after their pets, so would encourage everyone to use the ballpark and all other public facilities responsibly without making a policy change at this time.

Correspondence included an email from resident wanting to know status of the incident where their doorbell camera has recorded an unknown person walking by putting dog feces into their garbage can and complaints of unknown persons speeding and running stop signs needing to be issued citations.
